Once I get to Children's Specialized Hospital, I will meet a person by the security desk. They will talk with me and tell me the number of the room where I will be going.

Everyone at the hospital wants me to get better. I can always let people at the hospital know if I need something or have any questions.



When I get to my room, a nurse will make me feel as comfortable as possible. The nurse and others at Children's Specialized Hospital will work together to help me get settled into the hospital bed.



The nurse will ask me questions about how I am feeling and check different parts of my body. The nurse may use a thermometer to take my temperature, and a band around my arm to take my blood pressure.



The nurse may check other parts of my body to learn how they can help me get better. If I have questions about anything, I can ask.



My doctor will come to my room to talk with me. The doctor will touch and move parts of my body to learn more about how I am doing and how to help me. I can let the doctor know if something is bothering me.



Therapists will visit me in my room, too. They will talk with me and measure me. They might even stay to watch me eat. The therapists will learn the best ways to take care of me while I am in the hospital and when I go home.
