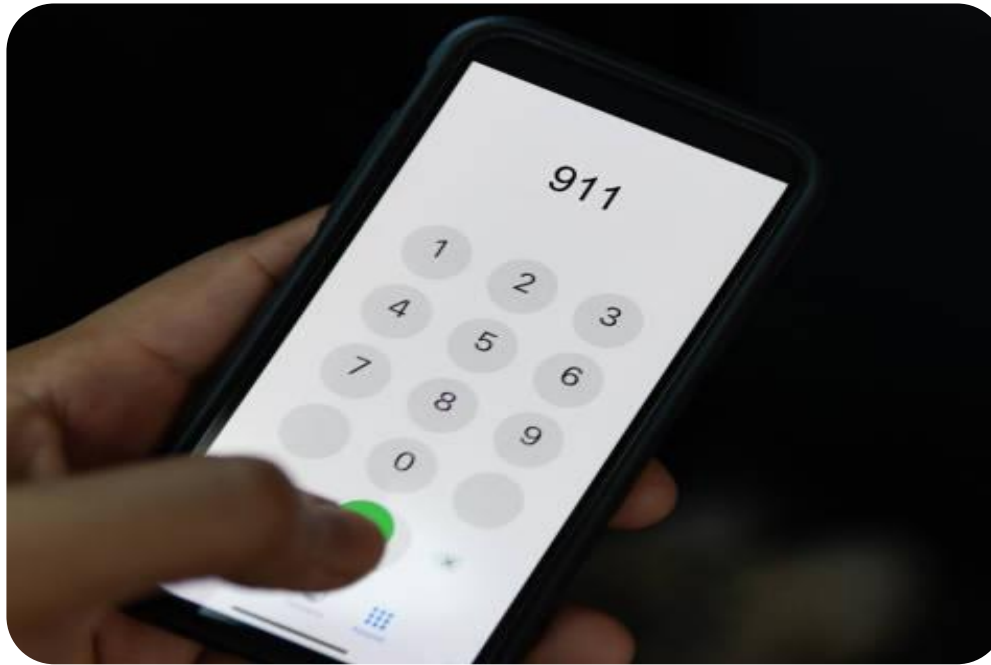

How to Call 911

I dial the numbers 9 1 1 on the phone.



I speak into the phone and tell the emergency dispatcher or operator my name and the address where I am.



I try to speak slowly and clearly.

I tell the operator if I or someone else is hurt.



The operator will ask me questions about the emergency.

I need to listen to each question carefully, then answer.

I need to speak clearly into the phone without yelling.



If the operator asks me to do something or go somewhere, I listen to the instructions carefully, then follow the instructions.

If I need them to repeat or reword the instructions, I let them know.



I tell the operator if I have difficulties following the instructions or answering the questions.
