Button and Coin Batteries





Some small round batteries are used to charge watches, key fobs, flameless candles, toys, and other items.

These batteries are called button or coin batteries.



It is important for me to keep these batteries away from young children and pets.



These types of batteries can be very dangerous if swallowed by a human or an animal. It doesn't matter if they are new batteries or used batteries.

These batteries can get stuck inside my body and can cause serious injuries.
