RWJUH Somerset Renovates Cardiac Catheterization Lab

Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital (RWJUH) Somerset, an RWJBarnabas Health facility, recently renovated its Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory, completing the final phase of its 5-year Cardiology Services expansion project. The renovations included the addition of eight spacious, private bed bays where patients prepare for and recover from their procedures and an isolation patient room as well as updated interior design finishes.

"Our Cardiology Services expansion project has upgraded our facility to enhance the comfort and convenience of our patients while ensuring that they have access to the latest technologies needed for timely, accurate diagnoses and treatment," said Patrick Delaney, Chief Administrative Officer, RWJUH Somerset. "This investment demonstrates our commitment to advancing the care we provide to improve the heart health of our community."
