The Emergency Department, now named The Hirair and Anna Hovnanian Emergency Pavilion, completed its final phase of total renovation in July. The department's update was focused on improving the patient's experience and the efficiency of care through features such as individual rooms and centrally located radiology services. Newly acquired technology, like point-of-care ultrasound, makes diagnosis and treatment faster for patients seeking emergency care.

Through philanthropy, we are also expanding outpatient services and bringing the latest technology to our patients, close to home. Technology, like the state-of-the-art NuVasive PULSE navigation system, is helping to guide us to the forefront of spine surgery. With help from generous donors, CMC became a teaching hospital in 2021, and we recently welcomed our third class of residents to the Grunin Foundation Graduate Medical Education Wing within the hospital.
