We provide group and individual services to children and adolescents who have experienced traumatic brain injury (TBI), have acquired brain injuries (ABI) and other associated medical conditions. We work with families to create individualized treatment plans to address the challenges of brain injury and advocate for school and community support.



Our Team

Members of our team include Neuropsychologists, Psychologists, Occupational Therapists (OT), Speech Therapists (ST), Physical Therapists (PT), Social Workers, Therapy Aides and Educators who work collaboratively to ensure the highest quality of care.

Our Services

- Assessment services are conducted to identify treatment needs and assist with educational planning.
- Individualized services such as
 Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy,
 Psychotherapy, Neurorehabilitation and
 Physical Therapy provide one-to-one care.
- Group services (at CSH Union Only) help children to develop and implement rehabilitative strategies with peer support.
- Case Management (at CSH Union Only)
 oversee the coordinated schedule, coordinate
 and refer to outside agencies (as needed),
 facilitate family meetings, support transition
 planning and community re-integration.

How is a Referral Made?

Referrals are commonly made by the patient's physician (inpatient or outpatient).

Appointments typically start as multidisciplinary evaluations and assessments. Treatment and service recommendations are made thereafter.

Patient Navigator is available to assist patients and families with the case management and coordination from the very start.
