To make sure your child has the skills that can potentially save his/her life, an educator from **The Burn Center at Cooperman Barnabas** will be teaching burn prevention and fire escape techniques, which will include a tour at school of the **Fire Safety House** on _____.

This *Aluminum Cans for Burned Children* mobile classroom is specially designed to teach children vital burn prevention and fire escape techniques through a fun, safe simulation of common hazards. The Fire Safety House is equipped with a living room, kitchen, and a bedroom/bathroom which feature the types of dangers children should look for. In addition, the house emits a non-toxic white fog to teach children to crawl low to safety. A heated door helps children choose the right exit and a ladder (Northern division only) on the second floor allows them to practice emergency escapes.

Our Fire Safety House is able to travel across the state, free of charge, educating children about fire safety in the home through the generous support of the *Aluminum Cans for Burned Children Program*, an aluminum can recycling program initiated by New Jersey's firefighters. To participate in this program your signed permission is required.
