What is Driving Impaired?

Driving impaired means operating any motorized vehicle, such as a car, motorcycle, boat, tractor and more, while under the influence of any substance.

Driving While Under the Influence of Alcohol



Alcohol use hinders sound decisionmaking, slows reaction times and reduces coordination, making accidents more likely.



Driving under the influence of alcohol is dangerous. You can harm or kill yourself, your passengers, other drivers or pedestrians.



If you are found to be driving while under the influence (DUI or DWI), you can be charged, fined and lose your license.







Driving While Under the Influence of Marijuana



Marijuana, just like alcohol, can **slow reaction times, impair coordination** and **distort your perception**, making accidents more likely.



Drivers with THC in their blood were roughly **twice** as likely to be responsible for a crash than drivers who had not used drugs or alcohol.

Think Ahead

Get a ride home. Call a rideshare, a friend or a family member to pick you up.

Agree on a trusted designated driver ahead of time. If you are in a group, agree on one individual who will not drink or use drugs.

Be aware of the effects of over-the-counter and prescription medications. Many over-the-counter medications can impact your ability to drive safely, whether on their own or mixed with alcohol.
