


Special Precaution Visitation: Safety is our top priority



We value the emotional support our visitors bring to our patients. For the safety of all patients, visitors and staff compliance with the below guidelines is required.



We require that you properly wear a face mask (covering nose and mouth), eye protection, gown and gloves while in the patient's room.



We will provide you with appropriate personal protective equipment- do not share your mask, goggles, gown and gloves among family members. We have trained personnel to help you.



Eating and drinking is not permitted in the patient's room at any time.



Wash your hands frequently. At minimum: when entering the hospital, upon entering or exiting the patient's room and before and after putting on the required personal protective equipment.



Limit touching any surfaces and follow social distancing



For your safety and the safety of others we ask that you limit your visit to only the patient's room you are there to see. Avoid going to other locations in the facility such as the cafeteria or pantry.

- Are you experiencing symptoms of COVID-19? If yes, we ask that you not visit until your symptoms have resolved.
- 1 visitor per day will be permitted at the bedside during normal visiting hours.
- Visitors for patients receiving aerosol generating treatments will require additional education during their visit.
- Please be aware that patients on special precautions are at a higher risk of potential transmission of certain viruses and regardless of wearing the provided personal protective equipment there is a chance you may contract one of those viruses.

Wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for Visitors

Clean your hands before and after taking on/off your PPE



Gown: A gown prevents droplets in the air from landing on your skin and clothing.



Mask: Do not touch or pull the mask down or away from your nose or mouth while you are wearing it. You must wear the mask even after you have stepped out of the room.



Eye protection: Face shield must be worn at all times while in the room. COVID-19 can be transmitted by touching your eyes or if virus particles get into them.



Gloves: Always keep your gloves on while in the room. Avoid touching your face or skin while wearing the gloves. Clean your hands immediately once you remove the gloves.
