The infusion center at the Cancer Center is in the process of expansion and enhancement. Project completion is anticipated to be in late 2019.



RWJUH Hamilton added a new member to its award-winning staff: TRU-D UVC disinfection technology.

"Trudy" is a robot (named by our staff) that helps keep patients and staff safe from harmful germs.



NEW in our operating suites:

Surgical robotic platform. This new robot has greater application for colon cancer, urology/prostate, and gynecologic surgery.

High-power laser for urology for the treatment of large kidney stones

Specialized instruments for spine surgery.



NEW at the Balance & Hearing Center:

Vestibular Evoked Myogenic Potential (VEMP) is the best method of clinically diagnosing and monitoring Meniere's disease (vertigo).

Auditory Brainstem Response (ABR) helps to identify hearing loss in those who can't be tested conventionally. It is also used to detect tumors or Multiple Sclerosis.

In 2019, we added physicians and:

- Began developing a neuroscience program
- Expanded Gynecologic Oncology
- Offered several telemedicine consultations for thoracic cancers and psychiatry

Introduction

In-Depth Community Health Needs Assessment

RWJUH Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) was developed in cooperation with the **Greater Mercer Public Health Partnership (GMPHP)**, a collaboration of hospitals, health departments, the Mercer County Department of Health & Human Services and other not-for-profit organizations to measurably improve the health of residents of the greater Mercer County community.


Mercer County's priority health areas to be addressed in a plan include:

- Underserved populations/health equity
- Mental health and substance abuse
- Food security/obesity
- Chronic disease
- Safe transportation/safe recreational spaces
- Maternal and child health



Results of Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) 2018-21

Of the major health concerns among residents in the greater mercer county community, obesity is the primary health concern among area residents, followed closely by mental health issues and substance use/abuse.



Priorities

The consensus of GMHP members determined the priority was to assist Mercer County residents achieve a life-long healthy lifestyle and weight.

The goals and strategies focused on the four life phases of community members:

- Maternal/Child Health
- School-Aged Children
- Adults
- Seniors

Protecting Community Health & Wellness

- HomeFront: As promised, this program was continued from last year and has grown! It now serves more families through additional nutrition classes.
- Mercer Street Friends: RWJUH Hamilton staff donates food and backpacks for MSF's Send Hunger Packing Program and volunteered to sort food at the organization's Ewing warehouse. The hospital also financially supports MSF.
- Special Olympics NJ: Nutrition classes were provided to over 60 athletes during a summer program.
- Preschool nutrition: Over 315 preschool students in settings such as Lakeview Child Centers, Mercer Street Friends' preschool and Better Beginnings took part in nutrition and cooking classes.



Smoking Cessation



On average, people try to quit smoking five to seven times before they successfully quit for good.

The Institute for Prevention and Recovery has helped thousands of people to overcome their addiction to nicotine. Our nicotine and tobacco recovery services are staffed with certified professionals who provide treatment under the Public Health Service Guidelines.

Scientific research shows that individuals are four times more likely to quit using tobacco when participating in a structured program as compared to attempting to guit on their own.

Services are provided to individuals of all ages in Essex, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean and Union counties.

- Provide information and individualized recommendations on the utilization of prescription and non-prescription smoking medication including Zyban; Chantix; and the nicotine patch, gum, lozenge, inhaler and nasal spray.

- · Identify effective tools to reduce withdrawal symptoms.
- Understand the impact of e-cigarettes, electronic nicotine delivery systems
- · Offer informational presentations in the community or workplaces about how staff and others can utilize our services.








COMMUNITY HEALTH RWJ Conference Center

MAKING A SOCIAL IMPACT: COMMUNITY HEALTH

Our **Farm to Family** program launched in Trenton seeks to help families live healthier lives.

- 15 families were selected to participate in the program, which ran from July through October, 2019.
- Every week, participating families received a crop share of fruits and vegetables fresh from Snipes Farm & Education Center in Morrisville, Pa., and information on a healthy eating or wellness topic.
- The program goal is to help families incorporate that information into their daily routines to change their eating habits for the better.
- Over \$1,000 Gift cards donations were provided by employees of RWJUH Hamilton to augment each family's produce shares.
