

## TSON Application Requirements

Application requirement for enrollment in the Generic Track

- Current enrollment in Union College
- Attendance at Trinitas School of Nursing Information Session within 12 months of application submission
- A minimum Union College or High school grade point average (GPA) of **2.5** (High School completion must have occurred within 12 months of application for High School transcript to be considered in lieu of Union College transcript).
- Transfer students, please refer to the website for further details
- Cumulative score of 55% or higher on the **TEAS** admission Exam
- Successful completion or current registration in Trinitas co-requisite courses as noted on the website
- Developmental courses may be recommended by academic advisor

## Admission to Union College

All Trinitas School of Nursing applicants must be enrolled in Union College. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide the following information and/or credentials to the Union College Admissions Office to complete the application:

- Union College admission application, apply online at [ucc.edu](http://ucc.edu)
- Official high school transcript or GED test scores
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary schools attended
- Email [nursing@ucc.edu](mailto:nursing@ucc.edu) to schedule an advisement appointment

Foreign transcripts may require an evaluation by the World Education Services (WES) or other authorized services, if the applicant is seeking transfer credits.



## Generic RN Track

The Trinitas School of Nursing/RWJBarnabas Health (TSON/RWJBH) and Union College (UC) jointly conduct a Cooperative Nursing Program. This program awards a Diploma in Nursing from Trinitas School of Nursing and an Associate in Science degree from Union College upon successful completion of the curriculum.

Prospective Trinitas School of Nursing students enter Union College as Health Science majors and apply to the Trinitas School of Nursing through the admission application process.

Trinitas School of Nursing is accredited by the New Jersey Board of Nursing and the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). The program offers a basic course of study in nursing and a sound theoretical knowledge base in nursing, biological, behavioral, and sociological sciences. This knowledge is integrated into academic and practical experiences within the health and illness continuum of patient care.

Students earn a total of 65 credits and upon graduation, become eligible to sit for the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX- RN) for Registered Nurse Licensure.

A negative criminal history background check and a negative drug screening are required by the School of Nursing for enrollment in clinical nursing courses starting with NURE 106.

Science and liberal arts courses (general education) may be completed at the Elizabeth, Plainfield, or Cranford campus of Union College. Nursing (NURE) courses are conducted on the Elizabeth Campus of Trinitas School of Nursing. Students may be granted up to 33 transfer credits from another college toward the Associates degree; however, nursing courses are not transferable. Transfer credit for college courses requires grades of C or better.

## Curriculum Design

Day, Evening and Weekend clinical sections are available for nursing courses.

Curriculum sequence presented below is intended for those planning to study nursing as full-time students.

Due to the rigorous nature of nursing curriculum courses, it is recommended that if the full-time curriculum sequence is chosen, students limit outside work obligations to support student success in the program.

Prospective students must meet with a Union College advisor for course planning.

All accepted students are required to attend New Student Orientation scheduled prior to start of classes.
